## 3 Ways to Find Leaks

### CHECK



Check for leaks. Indoors, look for dripping faucets, showerheads, sprinklers, and listen for running toilets. Outdoors, check irrigation systems and spigots or hose bibbs.

### TWIST



Twist and tighten faucet, showerhead, hose, and pipe connections to stop drips. To save more water, twist a WaterSense labeled aerator on to your bathroom faucet.

### REPLACE



Replace old or broken fixtures with WaterSense labeled models, which are independently certified to use 20 percent less water and perform as well or better than standard models.





## RUNNING OR SILENT ... LEAKING TOILETS ARE NO FUN.




- 1** Drop a few drops of food coloring into your toilet's tank.
- 2** Let it sit overnight.
- 3** If the color shows up in the bowl, you have a leak.
- 4** Flush after to remove any dye.
